SRS Miscellaneous Rubble Pile (MSRP) #2 Non-Time Critical Removal Action has been Determined

The United States Department of Energy (DOE) has selected the preferred alternative for a non-time critical removal action at the MSRP #2. A 30-day public comment period for the Removal Site Evaluation Report/Engineering Evaluation / Cost Analysis (RSER/EE/CA) was held from April 24 to May 23, 2008. No comments from the public were received.

The MRSP #2 is located in the center of the Savannah River Site. The majority of the area is lightly wooded with trees and underbrush. DOE has determined that the preferred removal action will consist of the removal, transport, and disposal of concrete rubble and soil, transite sheets, fluorescent light bulbs and 55-gallon drums containing roofing tar. The removed debris will be transported to a CERCLA Approved Landfill. Confirmatory sampling will be conducted and will be defined for each area of removal based on the constituents found to be in exceedance of the remedial goal prior to excavation.

The selection of the preferred alternative is documented in the Action Memorandum. DOE has worked with US Environmental Protection Agency and the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control to ensure that the removal action is consistent with all applicable environmental requirements.
