In the early 1950's, after over 300 square miles of land had been purchased for the building of the Savannah River Plant by the Federal government, several small towns, including cemeteries, were relocated to other locations throughout Aiken County. However, one small cemetery was moved and, over the years, forgotten.

Recently, a group of 15 Savannah River Nuclear Solutions employees volunteered to correct this oversight and clean-up the overgrown plot of land. Located on Hankinson Street in Jackson, the formerly wooded area little resembled a cemetery. Beginning work at 7 a.m., Friday, Jan. 22, within hours, trees, briars, bushes and debris had been removed and several headstones repaired.
